Shelf Layout Project

After some great input from the division members and goals that were established at the beginning, a track plan has been selected. Jack Merkel had submitted a track plan of Lometa on the GC&SF line from Temple to Clovis NM. Just up the line is the town of Goldthwaite. At one point this was a booming little town with plenty of railroad activity. It has all the features and goals that were established in the beginning. The track plan has 10 switching industries in the town, a town layout that has unique buildings that can be reproduced, water feature, turntable, and round house. This town has a lot of potential. We have also given a name to the layout, "The Goldweight and Central".

We are going to take a step back at this meeting and discuss the process of researching a project and where to find the material. Because this area is part of the Santa Fe railroad, I was able to travel to Temple TX and visit the Springer Archives. The Springer Archives is the eastern depository of the Santa Fe Historical & Modeling Society. They also contain the history of the Temple area and information on many of the US railroads. This archive is open to anyone who would like to research any topic that they have. This is true with most historical archives, if you have a question, they will help you find an answer. I will give a presentation on the layout and all the information I have gathered.
