
Tim Foote's tips for making old run better than new!





- Clean the wheelsets tread and axle extension with a Woodland Scenics eraser. I do this on new engines as well. The treads are not necessarily clean when they come from the factory and can have paint on them.
- Use the grey, soft side of the eraser. Clean the eraser with alcohol on a paper towel.
- The wheel and axle extension may be part of the electrical pick up circuit.
 I don't lube the axle extension. Grease and oil are insulators to electricity.
 I do put a drop of thin lube where the axle sits on the truck frame.
- Be cautious when removing the cap that covers the truck assembly. Most
 of them have very thin plastic clips and it is difficult to find replacements. I
 use an Exacto knife with the tip broken off to get under the clip and pry
 gently. Once the cap pops up, I place a thin piece of styrene under it, so it
 won't pop down again while I am disconnecting the other clips.
